CARITAS

Caritas is an organization which I hope Braintree Women's Club members will embrace and support as it has a place here in Braintree and we could serve and meet some of their needs. Caritas serves those who live here, most probably work here and serve us here. These are some statistics you should be aware of:

Over 70% of Caritas residents have experienced homelessness Over 50% arrive straight from homelessness Over 60% earn under \$20,000 a year 20% have nobody they can rely on for help or connection

Caritas serves those who would otherwise not be able to afford housing. It enables working men and women on minimum wage, veterans experiencing post- service challenges and low-income elderly and disabled citizens to live in a clean, safe home that they can afford.

It provides housing to working people who earn significantly less than this area's median income, who are often living paycheck to paycheck. The median income is \$20,700 which means that they cannot afford market rent. The average weekly rents ranges from \$135-155.

Each Caritas resident has a key to their own room where they feel safe and less alone. It is a Single Room Occupancy housing (one person per room) for individual adults. When filing for an application, all current financial information is required. Also, a first month's rent and security deposit at lease signing are required in order to move-in.

Each residence has a property and site manager responsible for the well-being of residents and the upkeep of the property. The commitment is to keep residents in their homes even if they fall on hard times and have fallen behind on rent due to an unexpected expense, illness or change in employment. Help is provided through job-training connection and rent support.

In our December newsletter the Community Service Committee will explain more fully how we plan to reach out to the local residence. We just want to share our excitement now as we begin an immediate connection. Braintree Women's Club is Partnering with Shaw's Market to provide a Birthday Cake each month for this residence. Perhaps some have never celebrated a birthday...now someone has remembered them! Someone cares!
